Scenario

You are the crew boss of a twenty person crew on a fire in Western Oregon. The main fuel type is heavy timber, mostly resembling a fuel model 10. The fire looks to be in the range of ten to twenty acres, burning on aspects of SE to NE with slope ranging from 25 to 45 percent. For the moment the fire is mostly a ground fire, with patches of surface fire in heavier concentrations of fuel, dead and downed woody debris. Middle of the fire burned hot with single and multiple tree torching from the previous day.

Access to the fire is best from a road on the uphill side of the fire, with the fire butting up against the road on the very top of the fire. The road itself is mid-slope with similar fuel type and loading above the road. You and your crew arrive at the designated drop point at 0730 to meet with the Division Supervisor just down the road from the top of the fire. The Div. Sup. wants you to hike the crew in right away and start line construction at the bottom anchoring into a small creek and working the line up the North side of the fire, eventually tying into the road.

At the moment your crew is the only one on scene, however two more twenty-person hand crews are expected to arrive in 2-3 hours as well as a type six engine. Due to an inversion that is not expected to lift until 1030 hours, there isn't any air support. However, once the inversion lifts there will be one medium available assuming another incident does not take priority.

Temperatures are suppose to rise to the low 90s and the RH is expected to drop to the low 20s by 1400 hrs. The wind is calm, but is expected to pick up to 10 mph out of the west after the inversion lifts. Ridge top winds will reach up to 8-10 mph with gusts up to 12 to 15. There are not any good safety zones close by. Your best escape route is back to the vehicles and down the road to a designated meeting area 2 miles away. The Division Sup. is anxious to get started and wants to send you and the crew in right now.

With the information given to you, how would you go about addressing the scenario? What would your plan be and what steps would you take to implement that plan? What sort of resources would you use, how would you use them and how much would you count on those resources? Understanding that in a real life scenario more information would most likely be available give your best answers to the previous questions.
